When Jesus started His work, He read these words in the synagogue in Nazareth:



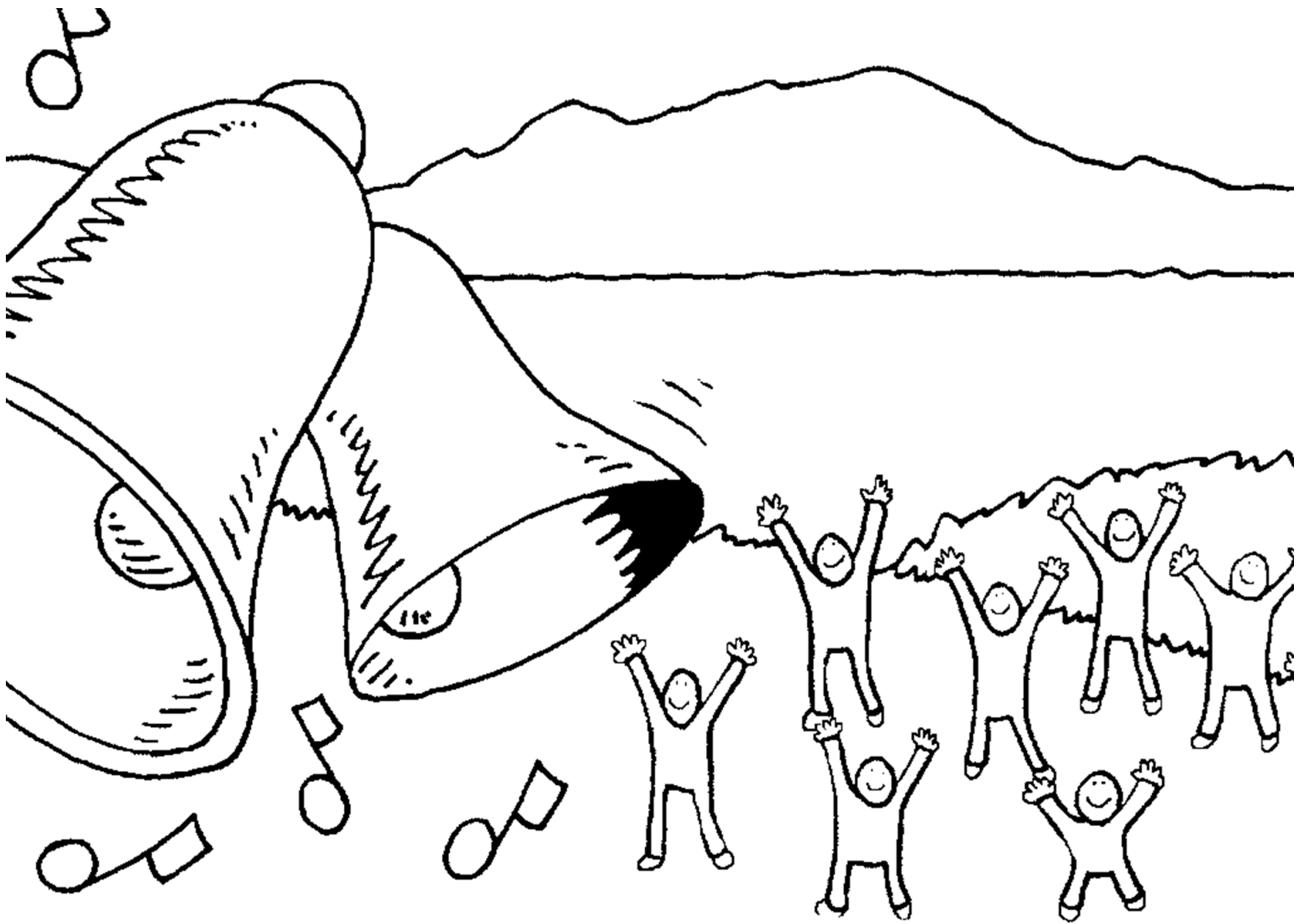
“The Lord God has put His Spirit in me.”



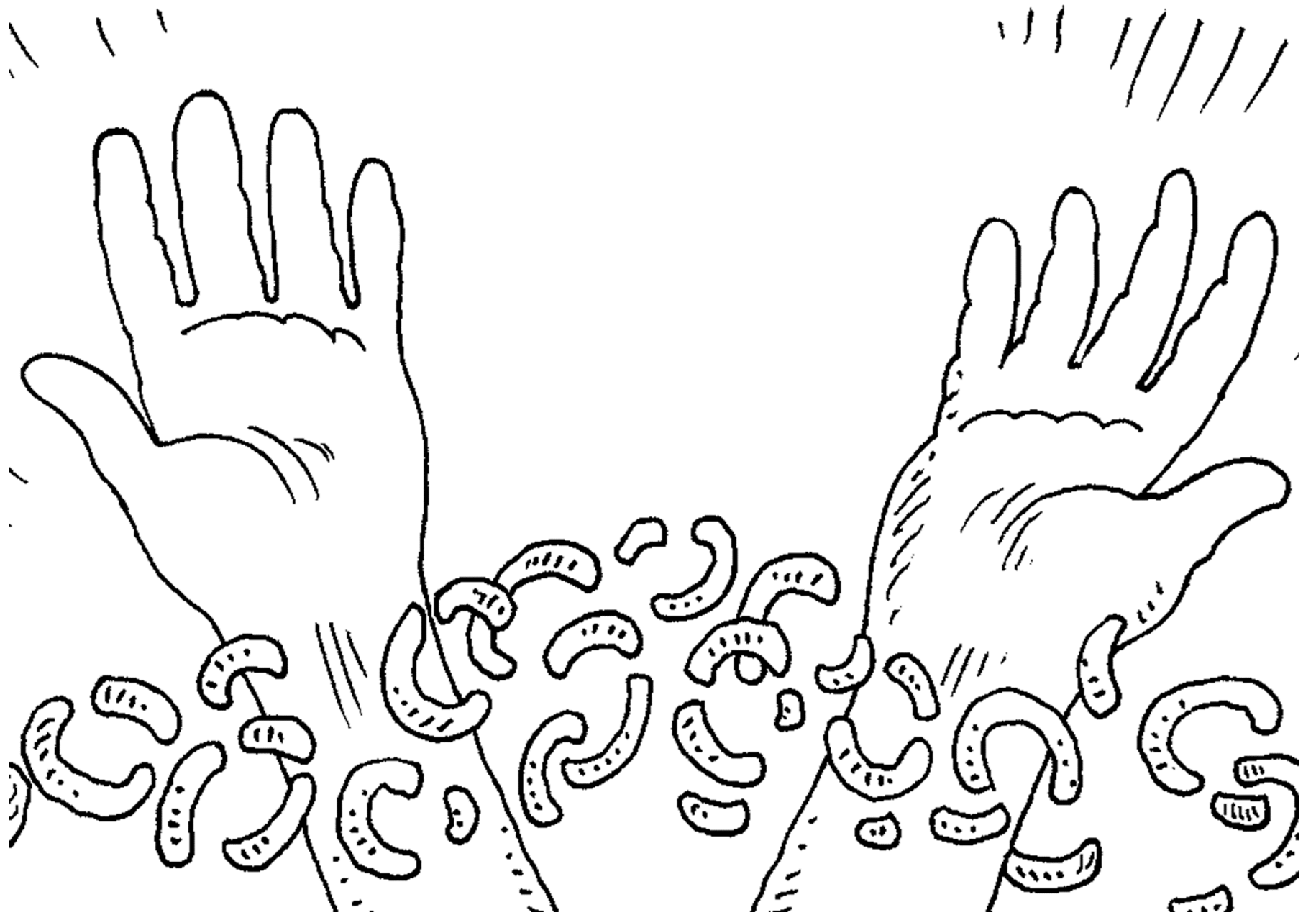
“This is because He has appointed me to tell the good news to the poor.”



“He has sent me to comfort those whose hearts are broken.”



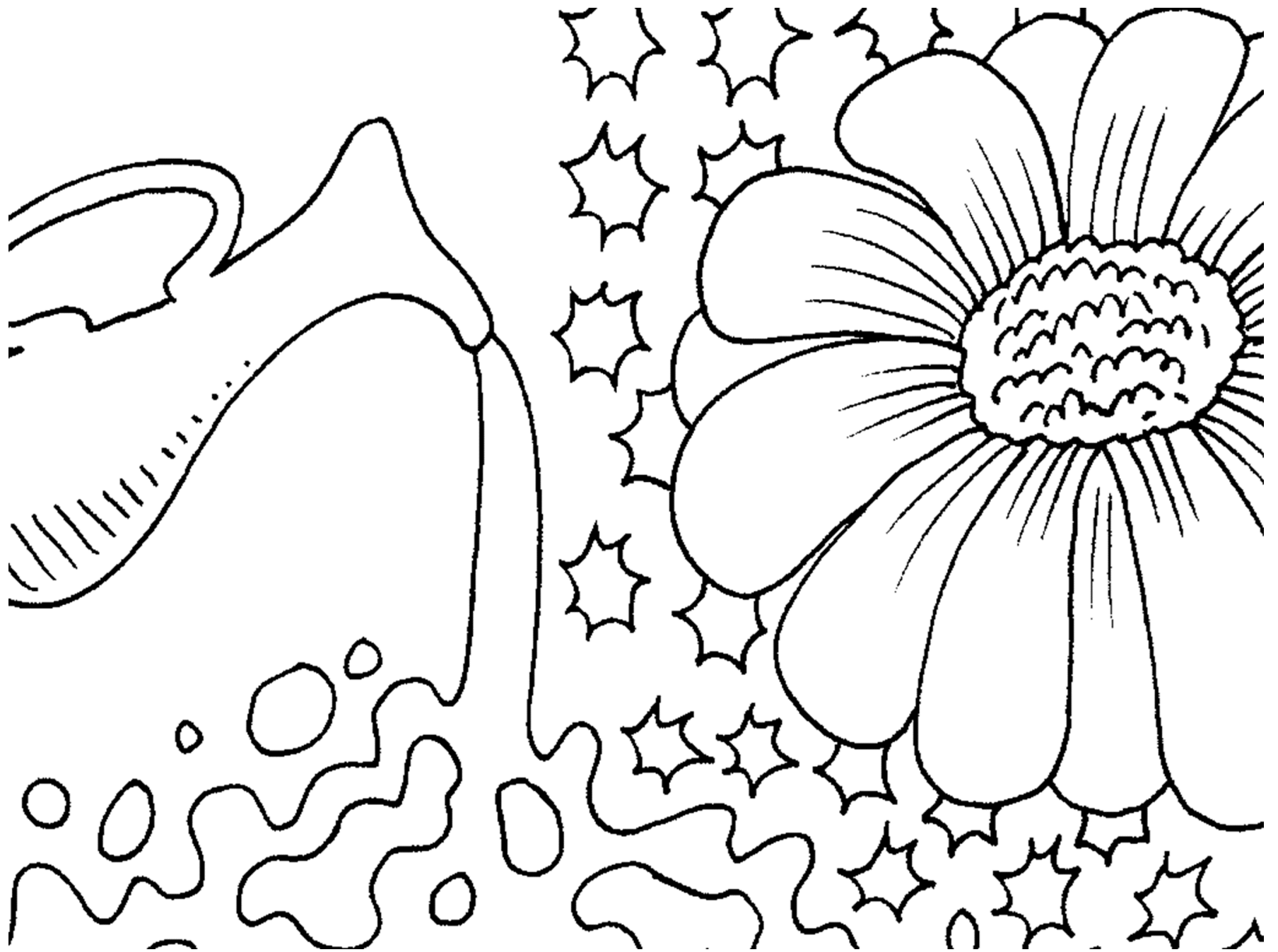
“He has sent me to tell the captives they are free.”
